# PTO minutes October 19, 2017

Minutes of 9/14/17 were approved

Janet Kinnane, PTO president, introduced the senior and junior class presidents, Jeff Martin and Jade Minnifield.

Treasurer's report: (Karen Clay)

\$8800 in account

So far this year we've earned \$2800 in dues and \$6350 in spirit wear, more than we earned in either category by the end of last year.

Fundraising: (Janet Kinnane)

Should we do more spirit wear? Student leaders say yes, and that they will let us know what types of styles students would like.

In school sale of spirit wear again? The last one, run by Janet Kinnane and Rachel Colker, raised approximately \$800.

It was suggested that spirit wear could be sold at the Nov. 15 Discover Allderdice event and the December 19 Multicultural Dinner.

Clarification on the Dragon Spirit funds was asked:

- The field did not end up being something we could pay for, nor the sign, because of zoning and district issues.
- Students asked if the money could be used to pay for fixing bathrooms\*\*. A long discussion was held about the state of the bathrooms, including many missing stall doors. Dr. McCoy noted that he brought this to the district's attention and maintenance workers were sent to measure missing doors, and will check on the progress. Many suggestions were made to take photos of the state of the bathrooms (without students in the photos) and testify in front of the school board. Parents are concerned about this issue, too, and offered to testify in front of the school board.
